THE MOST WESTERN VINEYARDS OF EUROPE

BRUMA, WHITE 2017

Vineyards: Grapes picked from the original vineyard planted in 2006 by Baron Bodo von Bruemmer, located in Adraga, Casal Sta. Maria and Almoçagem, all of them with distinct characteristics.

Year: The entire period of growth, until the harvest, was dry and hot, which had a positive impact on the flowering season and healthiness of the grapes. Though, August brought the typical foggy weather of Colares. The result were small bunches at the harvest, originating concentrated, balanced and aromatic wines.

Winemaking: The grapes harvested by hand are carefully selected in the cellar and then crushed and pressed cold. After the static decantation, the fermentation takes place in stainless steel, staying after that on fine lees of the fermentation until April.

Winemakers Comment: Greenish tone with reflections the bright straw. Lots of minerality, green apple and apricots. It also has notes of oyster shells combined with citrus fruits. It is

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very elegant and delicate. Full of concentration, with refreshing acidity. The final taste is intense and long, bringing again notes of minerality and sea.

Consumption: Should be drink at 8-10°C and can benefit from aging in bottle for 6 years.
